SPECIAL EXCEPTION SE 2020-03: APPLICATION BY MARC & MELANIE NUSSEL, TO ALLOW HORSES FOR NONCOMMERCIAL PURPOSES ON PARCELS OF 3 ACRES OR MORE IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE VIRESIDENTIAL SINGLE-FAMILY DISTRICT; SECTION 60-213 OF THE CITY OF WILLISTON LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE-CITY MANAGER JACKIE GORMAN City Manager Gorman presented Special Exception 2020-03 to the Council. City Manager Gorman discussed with the Council that the Special Exception to allow horses for noncommercial purposes had been approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission and she's bringing it before the Council for final approval. Councilmember Ross asked was the applicant in compliance with everything that was required. City Manager Gorman said yes. City Manager Gorman stated that Cottage Cove North Phase 3, consist of 4 lots and all meet the minimum size requirement for an R-2 zoning district. Easements have been put in place

Fire Chief Stegall told the Council he and Human Resource Director Brooke Williston meet with the Levy County Fire Chief and the Battalion Chief on coverage for Station 11 in Morriston and they still have issue they need to working out, just wanted to keep the Council posted on what's going on and should have an update before December.




